1. Roll Call (Lori Sutton)
2. Welcome (Suzan Nash)
3. Provider Update and/or Personnel Changes
 - a. WIRC: All 3 CoC units are filled. No personnel changes
 - b. MCS: Dusty Douglas is new Director. New woman in the office is doing data entry and intake. One family moving out, another family will be moving in. All 3 units are full. Two units were counted in proposal for this year, but should have been for next year.
 - c. YWCA: One 3-bedroom house in TH will be open March 1. No personnel changes.
 - d. Madonna House: Barb Hicks resigned at the end of November. No longer have a Volunteer Coordinator, looking into hiring a new Executive Director within the next 2 weeks. One room is open for a mother and child.
 - e. Samaritan Well: Cynthia is new as of October 3. Women's shelter is full. Men's shelter has 3 residents.
 - f. QUANADA: Kathleen Carie: new Brown/Schuyler County Advocate. Sexual Assault counseling position is close to being filled. 5 spaces open in shelter.
 - g. Two Rivers: Shelter funding available
 - h. Salvation Army: Four available rooms. No personnel changes.
 - i. St. Louis VA: Catchment area is about 20 prisons east of Jefferson City, MO and south of Jacksonville, IL. Rolando works with incarcerated male and female veterans up to a year prior to release, and 4 months post-release. He also coordinates services after they leave his catchment area.
4. CoC Grant
 - a. 2011 Grant Competition – renewal projects were approved, new projects still being reviewed. Last year new projects were approved in March.
 - b. 2012 Point-in-Time Shelter Count (Amanda Davis) Still waiting to hear back from New Start (Quincy), Transitions (Quincy), Starting Point (Monmouth), and Chrysalis House (Carthage).
