### **REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS**

**JUNE 5, 2017** 

As follow up to our April 27, 2017 posting of the General Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the Fiscal Year 2017 on the www.wciccc.com website; the CoC would like to encourage renewal and new project applicants to apply for funding specifically for Rapid Re-housing Projects that can be created from the bonus offered by HUD to our CoC. The CoC's Research and Evaluation Committee met April 6 to review our CoC's Point in Time Count; Housing Inventory Count and review Annual Performance Reports of current CoC-funded projects. Their recommendation was to seek renewal of all current Permanent Supportive Housing projects at their current levels and solicit new RRH projects through the bonus opportunity to fill the gap in services for individuals and families who do not qualify for PSH. At this time the detailed Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the Fiscal Year 2017 and bonus amounts have not been released by HUD. Both will be posted to www.wciccc.com as soon as they become available.
